

CRITERIA

- Selection for scholarships is based on the criteria listed below:
 - 1. The scholarships are targeted towards minority students who have graduated from high school and will be enrolled in institutions of higher learning throughout the United States. The scholarships are primarily directed toward minority students who are candidates for a college degree. However, all students may apply.
 - 2. All scholarship applicants shall have a minimum cumulative grade point average equivalent to 3.0 on a 4.0 grade point system (appropriate documentation is required for grade and SAT scores).
 - 3. All scholarship applicants are required to complete an essay of 500 words or more on "The Importance of Serving the Community" and forward it, along with the application, to the Foundation by May 30th.
 - 4. All applicants are also required to submit three letters of recommendation. The letters can be from your school, your church, a community organization, or a place of employment.
 - 5. Each applicant may be subject to an interview, and if so, will be informed by mail or telephone. Nothing in these guidelines shall prevent a student from being considered more than once for a scholarship.
- All scholarship winners shall receive notice when funds are disbursed. The funds will be disbursed to the institution in the student's name, once documentation is received by the scholarship committee confirming that the student is enrolled and attending the institution. The scholarship committee decisions are final.
- THE FOLLOWING MANDATORY INFORMATION IS NEEDED FOR YOUR PACKET TO BE REVIEWED BY THE SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE: A) A completed application; B) Signed and sealed official high school transcript; C) Copy of SAT scores; D) Three letters of recommendation; and E) A typed 500-word essay on "The Importance of Serving the Community."

Please note that based on financial circumstances, additional information (e.g., a copy of the student's and/or parent(s)' income taxes may be needed.
